What is Measure LL?

- Little Lake City School District is one of the top performing school districts in our area, but many of our schools were built 70 years ago and need important health and safety repairs, including testing for asbestos and lead.
- Measure LL is Little Lake City School District's Classroom Repair, Health and Safety Measure that will appear on your June 7 Ballot.



Measure LL

Health and Safety Improvements

- Measure LL can help repair deteriorating bathrooms, leaky roofs, cracked asphalt and aging playgrounds; upgrade air filtration and purification; improve plumbing and electrical wiring, and make upgrades to meet current laws for accessibility for disabled students and earthquake safety.
- Measure LL also includes basic security upgrades to keep intruders off school campuses.



21st Century Technology Needs

- One of our top priorities is ensuring that all students continue to have access to computers and instructional technology.
- Measure LL provides funds to help upgrade outdated electrical wiring, improve science, engineering, and computer instruction, and enhance Internet access.



What other priorities will Measure LL Address?

- Removes asbestos, mold and lead paint
- Repairs gas lines/deteriorating bathrooms
- Provides safe drinking water
- Improves emergency communications systems in neighborhood schools



Measure LL Fiscal Accountability Requirements

- Requires an Independent Citizens Oversight Committee
- Requires annual audits
- No money for administrators' salaries/benefits
- By law, all Measure LL funds must be used for Little Lake City Schools and cannot be taken by the State.

Measure LL is a \$36,000,000 bond measure. If passed, it will cost the average homeowner 3 cents per \$100 of assessed value for a maximum term of approximately thirty-two years.
